### Attendance and Punctuality

As always, we will be having a big push on attendance and punctuality this year as pupils' progress (both academic and social) is directly impacted by poor attendance. This year, we will be working in 'days' and 'lessons missed' rather than in percentages and parents will be alerted at the first sign of a child's attendance causing concern. Please note that holidays in term time are not authorised and are likely to incur a fine. Likewise, ten sessions of unauthorised absence within a ten week rolling period may also incur a penalty (possibly a fine).

### SPOTLIGHT CURRICULUM/AWARD

This year, we will be continuing with our SPOTLIGHT curriculum and are hopeful that, by the Awards Ceremony in the Summer Term, some pupils will have achieved their SPOTLIGHT Award. We have introduced a SPOTLIGHT Collectors' Card and once this has been filled (with a sticker for each aspect

of SPOTLIGHT), the child will be eligible for a SPOTLIGHT Award at the 2025 SMMJ University Celebration. Any aspects of SPOTLIGHT achieved last academic year will be carried forward to this year. This year, there will be more guidance provided as to what an Independent Project should look like/include. As a guide as to how to achieve recognition in each aspect of SPOTLIGHT:-

5-pupils will need to learn a new skill

- P-take part in an out of school hours performance (eq. school production/out of school production)
- O-take part in an oracy activity (eg. Speech Choir, a debate, deliver a speech to an audience)
- T-represent the school in a team (eg. sport team, choir, out of school ambassador)
- L-read 10 of our recommended reading books (L=Love of Reading)
- I-independent project of the child's choice (quidance will be provided on this)
- 6-(Gospel values)-be nominated as Disciple of the week multiple times/taken part in an out of school Charity Event.
- H (Health and Wellbeing)-complete at least 12 hours of extra-curricular activity
- T-Taken part in a residential trip/taken an out of school trip to a museum/gallery/the theatre

#### Parent Forum

Our Parent Forum Meetings are an ideal way for parents to be kept in touch with developments in school. They are also a platform for parents to bring to the attention any suggestions that they have for the future development of the school. ## High School Admissions

For our Year 6 parents, applications for high school are now open and will close on 31st October 2024. Application to high school should be made via the council that you reside in.

Details will be available on the council website. Should any parent require any support in completing the high school admission form, please do not hesitate to get in touch with school and a member of our team will assist you.

### Breakfast and After School Club

Breakfast Club (£2) - 8.00am to the start of the child's registration session.

After School Club (£7) - End of the school day to 17.30pm.

We ask that parents do not send cash into school but instead pay via our ParentPay system.

It is essential that parents book their child a place for each session that they require. Children should not be sent into the Breakfast or After School Club without first having booked a place via parent pay.

Year 3 pupils have brought home their ParentPay login details this week.

We ask that, out of courtesy to staff, emails are only scheduled to arrive between 8am and 6pm (Monday-Friday only). Weekend/holiday emails should not be sent to any member of staff.

# Healthy Eating

There is evidence to suggest that the healthier a child's diet is, the better able they are to concentrate. We would therefore like to offer parents a few suggestions as to what they might send in with their child to consume during their break times:-

Toast

Crumpet

Fresh fruit (avoid dried fruit at snack times)

Veg sticks

Low sugar rice cakes

Low sugar yoghurt

Soft cheese and crackers

Please note that crisps and chocolate will not be allowed to be consumed during morning break times. We recommend that children bring a labelled bottle of water to school to drink throughout the day.

### Musician of The Month

As part of our Music Curriculum, we would like to expose our children to a range of musicians living/dead, from a variety of cultures and covering a range of genres (classical, pop, rock, reggae, Musical Theatre). September's Musician of the Month is Bob Marley. The children will learn about Bob Marley and his music over a series of assemblies and some Home Resources will also be provided for the children. At the end of each month, we tend to have a music quiz to see how much information the children have remembered and how many pieces of their music they recognised!

### Year 4 Holy Communion

A short Holy Communion enrolment meeting for our current Year 4 pupils will take place on **Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> September** at **5.30pm** in the school hall. Please bring a copy of your child's baptism certificate with you. Your child will need to have been baptised in a catholic church to receive the sacrament of Holy Communion.

Please note that, unless a Mobile Phone contract has been signed (by the parent and child) and returned to school (for the attention of Mrs Culley), mobile phones will not be allowed in school. Mobile phones will be confiscated should a child without a contract bring one into school. Should this happen, the phone will be returned to a parent/responsible adult at the end of the day. Should parents wish their child to bring a phone into school(because their child is walking home/going home with someone different), please request a contract from Mrs Culley or your child's class teacher.
